OUR FEATURED HOMES

29 FALLSVIEW RD

This home was built in 1954. 2600 sq. ft. of living space on a large, landscaped property across from Webster's Falls. It is open concept with vaulted ceilings. Enjoy the unique artwork found throughout the home and the views from every window.

177 HATT ST

A one and one-half storey stone "cottage" built in 1838. A back kitchen was added in 1874 and major renovations completed in 1992 and in 2012, all respecting the original building. Locally quarried limestone. The front facade is cut stone broken course while the rest of the exterior is rubblestone. It features stone corner quoins and plinth at the front and back. Original Ontario pine planks throughout. Ask about the stable! The artwork reflects the owners' love of travel and 35 years in the Congo.

96 MELVILLE ST

Built in 1889 by William Burton, a millwright. It is in the style of a side hall, end gables Victorian and has front and side bay windows and a wraparound verandah with carved rails. Note the elaborately carved double-hinged front door with frosted windows and stained-glass transom. The unique 2 storey addition includes reclaimed brick exterior and fireplace.

8 PARK ST E

The British Tudor style home, built in the late 1930s, has black and white plaster detail, a slate roof and wrought iron railings, gate and balconies. It was originally the home of the Captain of the Salvation Army and included a "Council Chamber" where many came for help, guidance, and marriage. Beautifully landscaped for four seasons.

321 PARK ST W

There are documents on the bathroom wall indicating that the home was built before 1873 in a cottage style. It has been renovated to raise two-thirds of the second-floor roof, with one bedroom retaining the slanted ceiling and knee wall. The stair railings are original - and therefore short! Be careful. A Christmas wonderland awaits.

165 WATSON'S LANE

Our 'newest' house is a two storey, centre hall plan built in 1983 and backs onto Conservation areas. Beautifully appointed throughout. The owners have collected antiques for many years, and you will be able to enjoy the unique additions to the home as you tour.
